IV. Superintendent's Report

Dr. Wisniewski began the workshop session by giving the Board an update on the current and past developments happening in the district. Dr. Wisniewski stated that the district has finished the Start Strong Assessment, and that during the week of October 25th, Red Ribbon Week was held and culminated with the parade of costumes. In addition, Dr. Wisniewski stated that there would be a Harassment Intimidations and Bulling presentation for parents on Wednesday, November 17th. Moreover, there will be a preschool presentation on developmental milestones on Thursday, November 18th. Lastly, Dr. Wisniewski informed the Board that parent-teacher conferences would be Monday and Tuesday, November 22nd and 23rd.
